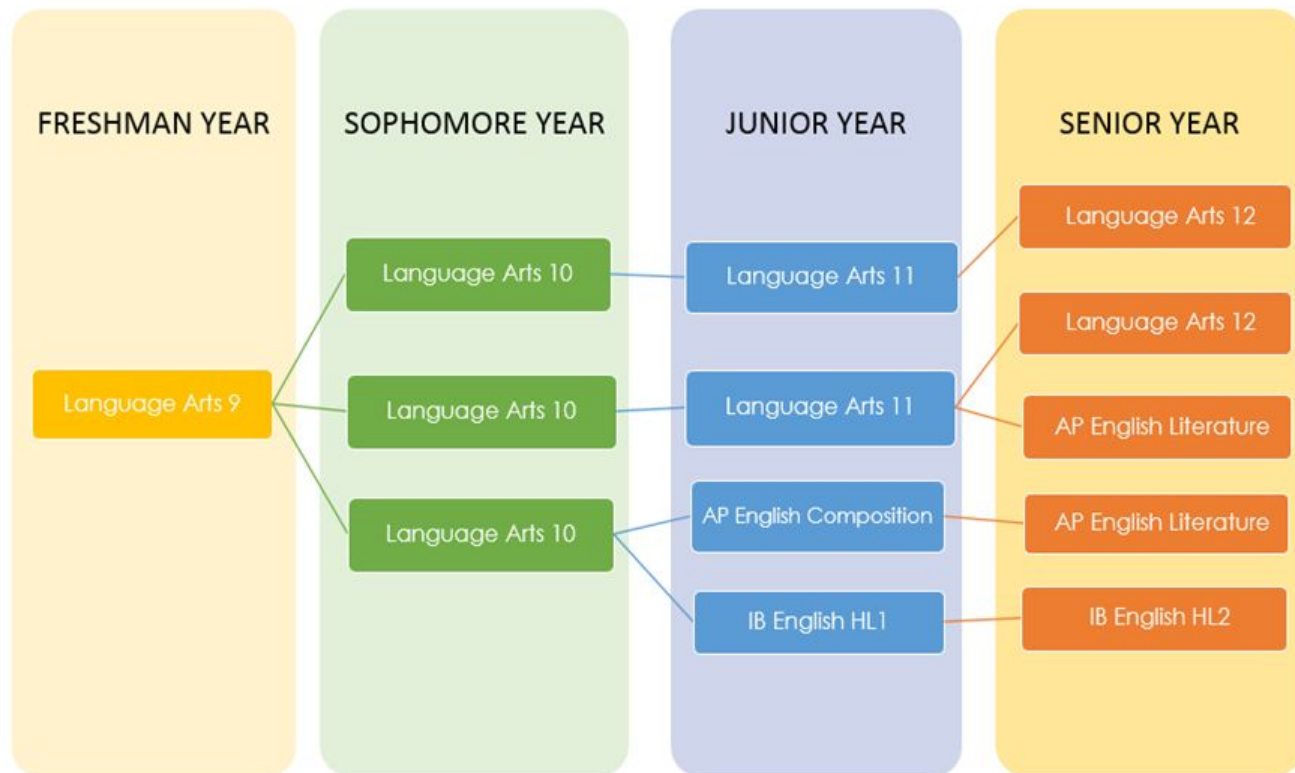

It increases academic opportunity

Research* shows that DP graduates are much more likely to be enrolled at top higher education institutions than entrants holding other qualifications.

Through creativity, action, service (CAS) you learn outside the classroom and develop emotionally and ethically as well as intellectually.

Class Choices are Important

Schedule adjustments are only made for the following reasons:

- **Schedule is incomplete** (does not have all 7 hours scheduled)
- **There is a scheduled conflict** (two classes are scheduled in the same hour)
- The student **previously failed or did not take the prerequisite course**
- The student is missing a course needed to fulfill a graduation requirement

Process:

- Notifications of errors must be submitted the **first week of a new semester**
